

Preview: *Pasanaku*, a film by Invernomuto commissioned by the association Bolivia-9

The Nouveaux commanditaires (New Patrons) are pleased to announce the preview screening of Pasanaku, a film by the Italian artist duo Invernomuto. in collaboration with association Bolivia-9. The event will take place on 15 June 2025 at the Musée d'art et d'histoire de Genève (MAH), in the presence of the directors and actors (free entry). The film gives a voice to the various generations of the Bolivian community living in Switzerland, and in Geneva in particular. Partly fiction, partly documentary, it brings together personal accounts, traditional dance and music, and many elements of Bolivian cultural heritage. Tracing the stories and collective histories that shape the construction of the Bolivian community in Switzerland, the work opens up a dialogue on the issues of transmission and the search for belonging.

Initiated in 2018, the project was born out of the desire to value and highlight the Bolivian diaspora in Switzerland from an intergenerational perspective. Supported by Les Nouveaux commanditaires (New Patrons), the association Bolivia-9 played an active role in developing the project, from drafting the

specifications to developping fundraising, up to organising the preview. The members of Bolivia-9, both commmissioners and actors of the film, play their own roles, talking about their experiences and the challenges they have faced in Switzerland, "el país de los bancos". The title of the film refers to a "pasanaku", an informal lending practice based on solidarity and trust. This saving system or shared pot, set up mainly to meet needs or dreams, is deeply rooted in Bolivian communities.

During the organisation of a "pasanaku", members of the community discuss their cultural differences as a result of coming from a country with multiple identities and 37 official languages. Based on the principle of capturing images used during sessions of the United Nations Security Council, Invernomuto films each testimonial using a rotating camera set up in the centre of the table.

Scenes of dance and music are added to the testimonials. Bringing together more than 150 Bolivian dancers and musicians from Geneva and

Switzerland, the "fiesta" celebrates a living, ancient and complex culture, transmitted through sounds and bodies in movement. The dancers in their shimmering costumes contrast with the sobriety of the neoclassical architecture. These sequences shot in the Musée d'art et d'histoire question the place of a minority culture in Western narratives. Behind the collective, festive energy, tensions are revealed – the difficulties of living together with a cultural heritage that is sometimes repressed.

Other elements are added to the interweaving of scenes, giving the film another dimension. The filmmakers pay tribute to "alasitas", another important aspect of Bolivian tradition. "Alasitas" - derived from the festival of the same name - are miniature objects or figurines that people give every year to wish each other good fortune. These symbolic items, in the form of paper tickets, goods, diplomas or residence permits, are filmed in up-close shots. Their presence resonates with the film's music, some of which was composed by artist and musician Elysia Crampton Chuquimia (Instagram/Website). They were recently awarded a Silver Lion at the Musica 2025 Biennale in Venice, in recognition of their body of work. Their practice blends experimental music, electronic composition and folk sounds, as part of a decolonial approach and cultural resistance.

The film takes us on an increasingly ecstatic visual and sonic choreography, driven by the musical rhythms, bright colours, dance movements and communicative warmth of the characters.

The Invernomuto duo-formed by Simone Bertuzzi and Simone Trabucchi-has been exploring the persistence and mutations of popular cultures in the globalised world for over 15 years. Through films, installations and musical collaborations, their work navigates between diasporic narratives, systems of representation and visual technologies. Their work has been shown at Nuit Blanche (Paris), the Liverpool Biennial of Contemporary Art, and the Bourse de Commerce-Pinault Collection (Paris).
